In 2002 he began working at the New Jersey state office in Somerset where he served as the

assistant state conservationist for programs and later for operations. Lee also served as the acting state conservationist for New York in 2006. He is originally from the community of Harlem in east central Georgia.


The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee


Spelling Bee, "irresistible, riotously funny and remarkably ingenious – gold stars all around."

Regulation information—fact or fiction

Much regulation information is shared and gained in several ways. Questions and answers are exchanged every day through "CB forums"

and "truck stop coffee symposiums." However, how accurate are the given answers? Let's look at the questions in this issue of the *Safety Scene*.

Fiction: How come I have to cross the chains on the front or on the back of a bulldozer when I'm securing it to a trailer?

Fact: You got me! Maybe that's the way your boss wants you to do it? That's a matter of preference. All the regulations under 393.130 indicate that you must have four tiedowns: two in the front, two in back and as necessary to secure accessory equipment, like a backhoe. Don't forget, if you use a direct tie-down, one that goes from the frame of the trailer and then attaches to the equipment, you only get half of its value. For instance, if you use G70 transport 3/8" chain with a working load limit of 6,600

lbs. as a direct tiedown, the value is reduced to 3,300 lbs. On the other hand, if the tiedown goes over the equipment and is secured to the trailer frame on the opposite side (indirect), you will get the full value of 6,600 lbs. For heavy equipment over 10,000 lbs., the tiedowns must have a minimum working load limit of 5,000 lbs.

Fiction: I was always under the impression that I couldn't transport gas cylinders with the valves on them. I'm a welder and it's a pain to always be taking the valves on and off the tanks.

Fact: Let me relieve you of some of your pain. As long as you're transporting the cylinders as a material of trade and you don't exceed the quantity limitations, you can transport them with manifolds on the tanks. Hazardous Materials regulation 173.6(b)(5). Check it out

Hope you feel better.
