## Michigan urged to keep wetland power

Michigan would be better served by keeping wetlands protection in state hands, rather than turning that responsibility over to the federal government, according to a report released Tuesday by regional environmental groups.

As Michigan legislators look to solve a \$1.7 billion budget gap for the next fiscal year, Gov. Jennifer Granholm has proposed shifting oversight of wetlands from the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

It's a move administration officials estimate could save as much as \$2 million.

But a report released by the National Wildlife Federation recommends leaving permitting for actions that have an impact on wetlands with the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality.

"While we believe there are some shortcomings in the current Michigan wetlands program ... returning the program to federal administration under Section 404 would neither result in a stronger, more comprehensive program, nor likely result in any cost savings overall," the report says.

"Instead, the state should identify resources as needed and make a commitment to maintain administration of this important program."

Federal agencies describe wetlands as areas where "water covers the soil, or is present either at or near the surface of the soil all year or for varying periods of time." Those areas are valued because they perform a variety of services. When wetlands disappear, they take with them habitats for wildlife, flood protection for humans and a water

quality buffer. Michigan has lost nearly 50 percent of its wetlands.

Michigan has been handling wetlands permitting for a quarter-century, and only New Jersey has a similar program. A spokesman for Granholm could not be reached for comment Tuesday. Opponents of Granholm's plan list several concerns with transferring responsibility to the Corps of Engineers. Among them is the fact the federal program does not require a permit for work such as depositing or placing of fill material, dredging or removing soil or minerals, and draining surface waters. In addition, environmentalists said a change could result in a longer permitting process and "less comprehensive" reviews of permit applications.

Another key issue is protection of isolated wetlands -- parcels no more than 5 acres in size that are not connected to a body of water. While MD-EQ has limited discretion in protecting these areas, the corps has no authority to do so.

"There are almost 100,000 acres or more of isolated wetlands in Michigan," said Marc Smith, Great Lakes State policy manager with the National Wildlife Federation. "So those would be unprotected."

Jennifer McKay, a policy specialist with the Tip of the Mitt Watershed Council, said once Michigan cedes its wetlands authority, it may be difficult to get it back.

"We will most likely not be able to administer it in the future," McKay said.

Also, personally invite at least one contractor and bring them along. We all know how hard it is to take off work to attend a meeting, so some prodding may be needed.

Jerry will be providing information about the benefits of LICA and our new Legislative Director, Scott Everett will be highlighting some of the political issues that Michigan LICA is undertaking that will help drainage and excavating contractors alike.
