



Trevor Young, S. Hecksel Farms LLC

In the summer of 1999, Trevor began helping his uncle, Sherm Hecksel. At that time, Trevor was a full-time 5th grade teacher. Trevor kept his full-time teaching job until July 1, 2003, when he and his wife Kelley purchased the business from Sherm, and Sherm entered into retirement.

Sherm, a founding member of MLICA, brought Trevor to a convention in 2000. Upon Trevor's purchase of Sherm's business in 2003, he became a full voting MLICA member. MLICA has given the Young family many fond memories and many good friends. They always enjoy the picnics and conventions. Their daughter, Emma, started attending conventions when she was just a baby, and she hates missing them now that she is in school.

Trevor and his wife Kelley have a few proud moments with their business...In 2006 Trevor and Kelley won the state Farm Bureau "Excellence in Ag" award. Trevor and his wife Kelley have been married for 20 years. Kelley is a Nurse Practitioner at their local doctor's office. They have two children. Emma is 11 and will be a 7th grader this fall. She loves her fair animals and horse, which she rides in speed events, like barrels, and poles. Eli is 7 and will be a 2nd grader this fall. He loves tractors and helping on the tile jobs. If it doesn't have a motor he doesn't have much interest in it.

Kelley and Trevor are involved with their church and have both served as Sunday school teachers and other church leadership roles. Trevor is also on the local 4-H fair's Livestock Committee and is the acting Dairy Superintendent at his local fair. He enjoys pulling his two antique tractors, an Oliver 77 and John Deere A, at local fairs and pulling contests. Kelley keeps busy with the kids, helping with the business, paperwork, and running. Land Stewards LLC

In 2001, Mark Wilson formed his company Land Stewards. At first the company's focus was on helping farmers navigate the world of environmental regulation (e.g. manure and nutrient management, wetlands, air quality and environmental site assessment, etc.). In 2010, they added management of Ohio LICA to their workload. In 2015, Land Stewards decided to take a different route and discontinued all previous services – including management of Ohio LICA – and transitioned into a multi-disciplinary consulting group specializing in caring for agricultural land affected by pipeline infrastructure. The company's pipeline work involves drain tile relocation and reclamation as well as soil restoration.

Over the next decade, Ohio and neighboring states expect to construct over 30,000 miles of new pipelines. Much of this new infrastructure will affect agricultural land. Consequently, they plan to grow and add more services (e.g. agricultural inspectors) in order to minimize the impact pipelines will have on agriculture.

Although working day to day with multi-national energy companies and union pipeline companies has provided many humbling experiences, Land Stewards' most exciting moment was realizing their pipeline success directly translated into new business opportunities for MLICA members.
