#### **Lansing Matters From The Desk Of Scott Everett**

HB 5889 and 5890

Status: Senate Floor (as of December 5th)

Sponsor: Representative Dan Lauwers

House Bill 5889 would amend the General Sales Tax Act (MCL 205.54a).

House Bill 5890 would amend and the Use Tax Act (MCL 205.94).

Current law provides sales and use tax exemptions for certain tangible personal property used in agriculture and aquaculture. Among other things, the exemption applies to agricultural land tile, portable grain bins, and grain handling equipment when sold to persons engaged in an agricultural business enterprise. House Bills 5889 and 5890 would specify that the exemption also applies when the property listed above is sold to a person in the business of constructing, altering, repairing, or improving real estate for others to the extent that it is affixed to or made a structural part of real estate and is used for an exempt agricultural purpose.

Also under the bills, the exemption would include the sale of personal property to persons engaged in a business enterprise and using or consuming the tangible personal property in "draining for agricultural purposes."

MLICA Supports HB 5889 and 5890.

#### **Member Highlights**

#### Talaski Farm Tiling Inc. of Harbor Beach, Michigan

I started this business May I, 1995, with a cousin of mine. In 2005 he sold out to me to stay farming because the business had grown larger and he didn't have enough time to farm.

I started in the Industry on August 5, 1979 working as a backhoe operator/laborer with Holdwick Tiling Inc. Bill Holdwick had a welding shop and in the winter we would saw lumber for hire. I did get to run his tile plow a little and survey land to get ready to tile. In October of 1985 I hired on with Hancor at a newly opened distribution yard to do sales and delivery. In the fall of 1986 we had so much rain that a lot of our sales were canceled and I was invited down to Hancor in Findley Ohio to work with Mike Cook, surveying and designing layouts for sub irrigation and tile drainage. I traveled to Ohio from my home in Harbor Beach each week and in the spring of 1987 I decided to leave Hancor to stay home with my family. I was hired by The Huron Soil Conservation District as a Sub Irrigation Technician to assist farmers with how to conserve energy with their sub irrigation in 3 counties and later including overhead irrigation in 5 counties. This lead up to making a decision to start my business.

I heard about Michigan LICA from tile salesmen and, at first, didn't want to spend the company's money to go because my business partner didn't want to go to the meetings. After awhile, I decided it was in the best interest of our business to learn more about our industry. I think I joined in 1996 and drove down to Lansing with Bill Holdwick and Gene Izydorek. I still remember Gene saying in front of the LICA Board that I would not run for a board seat that first year; that put me in relief. But by the next year, I was elected to the board and have served since.

The first machine I started out with was a D8K Cat with a 250 link plow and a brand new analog mast laser. At the MLICA annual meeting in 2008, I was talking to Jack Bower and ended up buying his 2040 GP Inter-Drain Plow and GPS equipment. Then I purchased AGPS software from Mike Cook; that was quite a spring learning a new machine and GPS thank god for Nate Cook. In the summer of 2013, I bought a 350 Bron plow because of its Telescoping tracks and auto-steer capabilities. We Run a PC120 Excavator and a 214 JCB Backhoe because of the large tires in the front.

One of the highlights of my business was when I called RWF and Ron Hall came out to show me how to reshape the front of the wear plate on my plow and he wanted to buy the D8K Cat I was going to put it on .

That told me that I made the right choice. Another highlight was meeting Scott Evert and getting to present a history of what tile drainage is to the Senate Ag Committee for the Exemption of personal property tax on Drainage Equipment that became law with the guidance of Scott and started a great Friendship. And in 2010 I chaired a GPS Field Day in Elkton Michigan in the Thumb on land rented by Hunger Relief, a Food Bank program. We as LICA members were able to tile land that would raise money to buy food in other need parts of the world; that was a great feeling.

I could not run my business without my family, my wife Joann does the bookkeeping and payroll, my son Russell worked for us all through high school years and helps move equipment when he can. I tell him that I can run a computer better that him because he uses 10 fingers and I only use one. But he has helped me learn and has gotten things straightened out from time to time. My daughter Vicki and her husband Kyle have two kids Ethan who is 6 and Allison who is 3 and wants to be 6. They help me put information on QuickBooks. Haley, my youngest daughter, is a senor in high school and plans to go to college this fall to become an Ag teacher like Vicki. I couldn't more proud of all of them.

One of the funniest memories in business was when my business partners' kids were in the field with us on a Saturday. It was muddy and both kids got stuck in the mud. Fred had to extend the backhoe out to them and walk out on the boom to pull them out and the retrieve their boots. But one of the most memorable times was getting my D8 plow stuck in a muck field, we took the backhoe in the field and dug holes to see what kind of muck we had to work with. It had morrow under it so we thought it would be ok. I backed in off the road and started from the outlet, moving ahead 400 ft, when we hit a pocket of peat moss. We went down about 5 feet in a second; I could walk out of the cab by pushing the door out into muck. Of course, we didn't have cell phones to take pictures, but that wasn't on my mind at the time. A friend of mine brought out his excavator and dozer to build a ramp in front of me and push 10 inch by 3 ft pads to pull me up. It only took 4 hours but that machine never saw another muck field again.

As I look back at my experiences with MILICA, I wouldn't change a thing: the friendships, the business contacts, the knowledge and how much it has improved my business. My advice to all members, new and old is to get involved, make it happen. When I am driving to Lansing two and a half hours I feel that this is still cheap for what I have gotten back. The best way to get what you want is to ask or dig into it and find what works for you. The best thing about Michigan LICA is that we are not in competition with each other, at meetings we talk about what works best for us and share it with any member that is willing to listen. If you attend meetings you will find that out for yourself. So I say it again, GET INVOLVED to get the most out of your membership dues.
